

# About The Camp

The camp operates at the 280 acre Indian Rock Nature Preserve, part of the Environmental Learning Centers of Connecticut, Inc., a private, non-profit organization, located on Wolcott Road (Rt. 69) in Bristol. The preserve's resources include the pristine 9 acre Indian Lake with two swimming areas, a farm, a fleet of canoes & kayaks, miles of forest trails to explore, and many indoor areas for program use. The Orchard House and new Bird Building provide program, lunch room, offices, first aid, and gift/snack shop facilities. The director and full-time staff are environmental education professionals who, along with our summer staff, encourage and facilitate discovery and exploration through hands-on experiences. Our program sites are located throughout the preserve, for an enhanced small group participation. The camp is licensed by the state of Connecticut.



## \*\*\*Earth Magic\*\*\*

### For boys and girls entering K - 1st grades

**June 20-24 TRAILSIDE DISCOVERIES:** Each day we will hike a different trail using our five senses to explore life along the way. After the hike, there will be a follow-up activity to reinforce the discoveries of the day.

**June 27-July 1 SCIENCE MAGIC:** Discover the magic of science this week as you experiment with sounds, light, motions, and colors in a natural setting.

**July 5-8 SMALL LIFE:** Explore the world of small creatures from worms, spiders, insects, and other little creatures along with interesting little plants. Discover how they use their senses and compare them to yours. **4 day week - \$155**

**July 11 - 15 FARM LIFE:** Work with and learn about our horse, pig, cow, rabbits, honey bees, chickens, and sheep. Visit a different animal each day and make a craft or product from each animal.



**July 18-22 WATER LIFE:** Investigate many of the wondrous creatures that make the water their home. Streams, lakes, ponds, and swamps will be visited in this search for small and large animals of the watery world. Bring your fishing pole the first day to learn the skills for fishing for Largemouth Bass in Indian Lake!

**July 25-29 AMAZING ANIMALS:** Learn about mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, and insects by visiting with live and mounted animals. After an exciting hands-on visit, venture into the forest, pond, or stream in search of the animal's natural homes.

**Aug. 1-5 KIDS ROCK:** Learn about different kinds of rocks and start your own rock collection. Explore outside to see how water, ice, and wind continue to shape the earth. Discover how mountains are formed, make your own volcano erupt and do fun, hands-on activities.

**Aug. 8-12 NATURE DETECTIVE:** Discover the secrets of our natural world by learning how to be a good investigator. Learn about nature, then use clues to find hidden daily treasures!



**Aug. 15-19 INDIAN WAYS:** Explore the days when only Indian footsteps walked the forests of Indian Rock. Learn about their culture while visiting our wigwams. Taste Native American food, make an arrowhead necklace, shield & more!



**Aug. 22-26 SO LONG TO SUMMER:** Join us for a week of fun and games as we say good-bye to summer. Treasure hunts, forest games, and a barbecue party will round out the week!

# \*\*\*Discoverers\*\*\*

## For boys & girls entering 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grades

**June 20-24 STEP OUTSIDE:** Put the right foot forward this summer by stepping outside to explore. Spend time fishing, swimming, and hiking the preserve trails.

**OR**

**GEMSTONES & GEOLOGY:** Enjoy rock collecting, stone polishing, jewelry making, and even panning for gold as you learn about rocks, minerals, and features of the land around us. Do experiments to create a volcano & geyser.

**June 27-July 1 FARMER:** Work with and learn about farm animals and the products they provide. Visit with a horse, cow, pig, sheep, chicken, turkey, rabbit, and honey bees and make a craft or product from each animal.

**OR**

**TIME TRAVELER:** Journey back with us through time and experience life from the Stone Age through ancient civilizations to the future. Crafts, foods, and lifestyles will be explored in this week of discovery.

**July 5-8 TRAIL BLAZERS** Days of guided self discovery and travel through the 280+ acres of Indian Rock Nature Preserve.  
**4 day week - \$155**

**OR**

**ANIMAL ART:** Have fun learning about animals while making your own drawings and sculptures. Use your art work to create mini-habitats and exhibits. **4 day week - \$155**



**July 11-15 I SPY:** Become a spy team member. Your job, should you accept it, will be to spy on others without being seen or heard. You will learn how to sneak up, listen, and observe what others are doing. Improve your skills as you learn how to camouflage yourself, move quietly, use sign language, make codes, and put your observations together to understand what is going on.

**OR**

**FASCINATING CREATURES:** Visit with live & mounted birds, mammals, reptiles, amphibians & insects! Then venture outside to explore their natural habitats and find clues of their presence!

**July 18-22 WORLD OF FLIGHT:** Investigate the principles of flight through natural flyers and flying machines. Make gliders, boomerangs, and parachutes and have fun flying them. Learn how bats, birds, and insects have mastered life on the wing. We will highlight the week with a visit to Robertson Airport!

**Special fee - \$195**

**OR**

**COLONIAL TIMES:** Step back in time to be a pioneer. Try your hands at colonial crafts, games, and preparing colonial foods. Make a bees' wax candle, corn husk doll, miniature stone cabin. Each day will feature a colonial food to make and eat.

**July 25-29 TREASURE HUNTER:** Learn the skills of a modern day treasure hunter. Discover how to unearth clues to find lost treasure, whether on land or under water. You will search for different hidden treasures each day, and take home your share of the loot!

**OR**

**INDIAN ADVENTURES:** Look back in time to explore Native American culture. Visit wigwams and an authentic rock shelter used by ancient tribes. Learn the many fascinating ways tools, foods, and crafts were used and created by early native peoples.



**Aug. 1-5 FISHING:** Gain practical fishing skills and an understanding of the needs of water life in and around Indian Lake.  
**Bring your fishing pole! (button type casting reel preferred)**

**OR**

**YOUNG SCIENTIST:** The natural world is science in action! Use your senses to engage in hands-on experiments and activities. Explore this realm of science to unlock many of its mysteries.

**Aug. 8-12 REPTILES AND AMPHIBIANS:** Learn to identify Connecticut frogs, snakes, turtles & more and explore their secret world. Using our live collections, campers will acquire care and handling skills.

**OR**

**WOODLAND GAMES:** Fun and games in the forest are the themes for this week! Capture the flag, treasure hunts, and hide & find are just some of the many activities planned for this action-packed week!

**Aug. 15-19 PATHFINDERS:** If you enjoy the outdoors, join us this week as we learn how to have safe outdoor experiences. Learn about maps, basic compass, knots, plant and animal hazards. Have a cookout, and learn how to find your way in the forest so you won't get lost.

**OR**

**SPACE DISCOVERY:** Explore the solar system and the stars in our STAR LAB planetarium. Learn about outer space and the history of space travel. Build and launch your own model rocket!

**Aug. 22-26 SO LONG TO SUMMER:** Join us for a week of fun and games as we say good-bye to summer. Treasure hunts, forest games, races, and a barbecue party round out the week!

# \*\*\* Explorers \*\*\*

## For boys & girls entering 5th & 6th grades

**June 20-24 ART OF NATURE:** Learn to draw and paint animal and plant life along with learning illustration techniques using a variety of artist media.

**or**

**EXPLORATION OF ARCHERY:** The basic skills of archery will form the foundation of this week. Leave modern technology behind while discovering the lost art of constructing primitive archery equipment from plants, animals, and rocks. Successful completion of this week may qualify participants for the Archery Boy Scout Merit Badge.

**June 27-July 1 SUPER SLEUTHS:** Hone your skills of deduction and reasoning as we use a detective's eye to observe the living world. Investigation skills will be applied to searching, tracking, mysteries, and surprises!

**or**

**NATURALIST:** Gain practical skills and an understanding of the outdoors. Learn to identify CT wildlife as you make your own nature guide. Learn to take pictures, make drawings, collect plants, and record your observations.



**or**

**KAYAKING:** Here's your chance to try out a fast, nimble paddle craft. You will learn basic paddling technique, water safety, and put your skills to the test by playing kayak games.

**July 5-8 SEARCH & RESCUE:** Learn the many methods of searching the wilderness for lost people and objects. Rescue techniques will be employed as teams carry out a mission each day! Basic first aid and survival skills will be introduced throughout the week. **4 day week - \$155**

**or**

**SUN, SAILS, AND SUBMARINES:** Learn to harness the power of the sun and wind through experiments and projects. Make a sail boat to sail on the lake, a submarine to experiment with underwater, and learn how to cook with the sun.

**4 day week - \$155**

**July 11-15 COLONIAL TRADES:** Try your hands at ancient skills including: Blacksmithing, basketry, tin punching, stenciling, fireplace cooking, leather working, and primitive pottery.

**or**

**OUTDOOR ADVENTURES:** Learn the skills necessary to be comfortable outdoors for the day. Learn about clothing, nutrition, safety, and lost proofing yourself. Your day will be spent out on the Preserve exploring the far reaches of Indian Rock and our new adjoining South Mountain Preserve. Cameras and binoculars will be used on explorations to learn and record the natural history we discover as we explore these areas.

**July 18-22 WILD ANIMALS:** Venture into the preserve and discover the variety of amphibians, reptiles, birds, and mammals that live here. Learn where to find different species and visit with live and mounted animals throughout the week.

**or**

**SPLASH:** A week of beach-front activities including: swimming, water polo, canoeing, volleyball, and a beach party!

**July 25-29 ANIMAL SCIENCE:** Expand your knowledge of farm animals as you become a junior farm hand. Raise up a chick of your own and help with farm projects. Learn to care for a horse, cow, pig, sheep, chickens & rabbit.

**or**

**SOLVE IT:** Experiment with the physical world around you! Solve problems involving pulleys, weights, ramps, ropes, and perform chemical experiments. Conduct actual experiments that test the laws that govern the universe!

**Aug. 1-5 ROCKETRY:** 3-2-1 blast off to a week of discovery, learning all about rockets, space vehicles, and galactic travel. Learn how rockets work by building and launching your own model rocket.

**or**

**CANOE FISHING:** Canoes will serve as vessels of discovery as we paddle and fish the waters of Indian Lake. Basic canoeing and safety skills will start the week. Learn a variety of techniques on fishing for Largemouth Bass in a canoe. In-depth studies of fish ecology and anatomy will be coupled with advanced studies of the Indian Rock watershed.

**Aug.8-12 EXPLORERS:** Become confident in the outdoors by learning basic camping skills. Gain experience in shelters, outdoor cooking, orienteering, health, and sanitation. An overnight outdoors on the preserve will round out the week.

**Special fee - \$220**

**or**

**SKY WATCH:** Come and explore our atmosphere and beyond using knowledge of astronomy and meteorology. Spend time observing the stars in our STAR LAB planetarium and learn how to utilize elements of the sky for survival skills like navigation and cooking.

**Aug.15-19 TRY IT:** This is a sampler week so you can try a variety of different activities offered at camp. Each day will include different activities including; canoeing, archery, arts & crafts and nature exploration.

**or**

**CANOEING & KAYAKING:** Learn the basics of handling a canoe and kayak. Launch, paddle, portage, and learn safety and rescue techniques as you explore Indian Lake.



**Aug. 23-27 SO LONG TO SUMMER:** Join us for a week of fun and games as we say goodbye to summer. Treasure hunts, forest games, races, and a barbecue party will round out the week!

# \*\*\* Adventurers \*\*\*

## For boys & girls entering 7th, 8th, and 9th grades

**June 20-24 FARM HAND:** Farmers are the true handymen. The need to maintain a farm requires a multitude of skills. Learn by doing as you're guided through a farm day caring for the farm and working on farm improvement projects.

**OR**

**KAYAKING:** Here's your chance to try out a fast, nimble paddle craft. You will learn basic paddling technique, water safety, and put your skills to the test by playing kayak games.

**June 27-July 1 FORT BUILDING:** Put your hands to work learning to build a fort on the nature preserve. You will learn to hammer, cut, lash, and assemble a group fort. This is great for kids who always wanted to build a fort and don't have the backyard to do it. *Limited to 10 campers*

**OR**

**OUTDOORSMAN:** This is a follow up to those who have taken Explorers before and will cover more advanced outdoor skills for camping and other outdoor recreational pursuits. There will be an overnight at Indian Rock to highlight the week and learn night hiking skills. This week differs from survival skills in that it will use current technology in the outdoors. **Special fee - \$220**

**July 5-8 SURVIVAL SKILLS:** Learn all the skills necessary to survive in the wilderness. Learn how to use a map & compass to bushwack off trail. Advance your cooking skills throughout the week as we prepare our lunches over camp stove and open fire. Wild edible foods, wilderness first aid, obtaining water, proper foot care, walking techniques, gear selection, hypothermia, weather, rope skills, fire building, and camp skills will be covered. An overnight at Indian Rock will put all your skills to the test. This week differs from Outdoorsman in that you will learn primitive outdoor skills based on the materials around you and not modern equipment. **Special fee - \$180**

**OR**

**CANOE FISHING:** Canoes will serve as vessels of discovery as we paddle and fish the waters of Indian Lake. Basic canoeing and safety skills will start the week. Learn a variety of techniques of fishing for Largemouth Bass in a canoe. In depth studies of fish ecology and anatomy will be coupled with advanced studies of the watershed. **4 day week - \$155**

**July 11-15 ADVANCED ROCKETRY:** Advance your rocket building skills and design and build your own rocket!  
**Special fee - \$195**

**OR**

**KAYAKING:** Same description as June 20 week.

**July 18-22 CANOEING:** Learn the basics of handling a canoe. Launch, paddle, portage, and learn safety and rescue techniques as you explore Indian Lake.

**OR**

**ARC OF THE ARROW:** Examine the hidden science behind the art of archery and enter the world of physics. Conduct numerous physical experiments using the arrow and the bow while improving your skills as an archer. Each day will include time on the range for archery skill development.

**July 25-29 WACKY MACHINES:** Spend the week making a variety of wacky machines. The week will feature a special machine to make and test. We will make a car, catapult, and air car!

**OR**

**KAYAKING:** Same description as June 20 week.

**Aug 1-5 SMITHING:** Learn the skills of a blacksmith, tinsmith, silversmith, and coppersmith by making a project using each metal through forging, smelting, and working with sheet metal and wire.

**OR**

**NATURE ENTREPRENEUR:** Using objects and materials from nature, learn how to create art and craft items that you will then market at the end of the day. "Critters," air brushed T-shirts, and more. Each camper in the class will share the profits at the end of the week!

**Aug. 8-12 INTERMEDIATE KAYAKING:** Further your paddling skills and work on your roll. A day trip to an easy section of a river will round out the week. **Special fee - \$220**

**OR**

**HIKING ADVENTURES:** Enjoy day hike adventures to other parks and nature preserves. Prerequisite: either Explorers, Outdoorsman, or Survival Skills. **Special fee - \$240**

**Aug. 15-19 BIRDS OF PREY:**

Learn about birds of prey, their lives in the wild, and the adaptations that make them special. Learn what it takes to care for injured and captive raptors. Learn the basics of handling live birds of prey, and start on the road to learning to care for wildlife.



**OR**

**WATER SPORTS:** Spend the week on Indian Lake canoeing, kayaking, snorkeling, and swimming. Play water games and learn the basics of water safety and rescue skills.

**Aug. 22-26 INTRO TO AIKIDO:** Aikido is a Japanese martial art with a philosophy based on peaceful resolution of conflict. Aikido teaches one to respond to a physical attack without hitting or kicking back. It uses throws and holds to neutralize an attacker. This is a great martial art for kids who wish to learn to stay calm, centered, and relaxed while they defend themselves. It does a great job of teaching coordination and power through softness. The camp week will cover exercises, teach how to fall safely, and some basic techniques of self defense.

**OR**

**SO LONG TO SUMMER:** Join us for a week of fun and games as we say goodbye to summer. Treasure hunts, forest games, races, and a barbecue party will round out the week!

# \*\*\*Rangers\*\*\*

## For boys & girls entering 10th grade

**June 20-24 COUNSELORS IN TRAINING: Minimum age 14 years:** Learn the skills to become a counselor in training. You will receive training in teaching young children along with training in first aid, safety, and camp operations. This training course is designed to prepare teens prior to or just entering the work force with skills required of summer camp counselors and lifeguards.

**RANGERS CHOICES:** Boys and girls entering 10th grade may also choose to participate in Adventurers activities in any week during summer camp. All camp fees apply.



### Items Prohibited From Camp

- \* Portable video gaming devices
- \* Playing cards (of any kind, including magic cards)
- \* Walkmans, iPods, or any other portable music devices
- \* Cell phones are not allowed to be used during camp hours
- \* Personal items that may have a significant value
- \* Possession of knives of any kind, fireworks, matches, tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or any kind of firearms or replicas will result in expulsion from camp and referral to the local police department if appropriate.



# CAMP BUSING

Bus route serves: Burlington, Bristol, Plainville & Farmington

**The bus service is available for \$45 per week. Additional siblings ride free!**

The pick-up and drop-off times will vary depending on traffic and weather. Your child should be at the bus stop 10 minutes prior to the pick-up time, and parents should be at the bus stop 10 minutes prior to drop-off time. The bus may be up to 10 minutes late. **Unless you have put a check mark on the registration form giving permission for your child to walk from the bus stop, no child will be let off the bus unless a parent or guardian is present.** Children will be returned to camp after completion of the bus run if there is no one to pick them up at the designated drop-off point.

*No medications will be accepted at the bus stop. A parent or guardian must bring any medications to Indian Rock and sign them in, and pick them up at the end of each week.*

Riding the bus is considered a privilege. Campers are expected to have good, safe behavior at all times while riding the bus. Campers whose behavior becomes a problem or is unsafe will lose their bus riding privileges.

Our bus will be marked with a sign reading **Indian Rock Nature Preserve.**

## Camp Fees:

A standard one-week session of camp is \$190.

Some weeks have a different fee and is noted under their program description.

\*\*All campers who are not currently a member of Environmental Learning Centers of Connecticut must become a member. Membership is \$25 for each youth, or \$50 for the entire family. All memberships expire February 1st.

## Payment Policy:

\*Full payment is due at time of registration when registering for less than 4 weeks of camp per child.

\*Membership must be paid in full at time of registration.

\*Campers registered for more than 4 weeks of camp may pay in 3 equal installments due on March 1st, April 1st, and May 1st, 2011.

\*After the start of camp (June 20, 2011), full payments are due at time of registration.

\*If payment is not made prior to the time required above, the camper will be removed from any future weeks and the opening given to other individuals without notice. The Center will be under no obligation to permit future attendance.

\*Partial payments for any week are not acceptable.

\*Optional busing fees must be paid in full at time of registration payment.

\*Morning or aftercare may be paid for as needed on a space available basis. Any camper dropped off prior to 8:45 a.m., or picked up after 4:15 p.m. must have care paid for on that day.

## Fee Discounts:

\*Discounts are applied to Camp Fee only and are not applied to busing, membership, morning-care, or after-care.

\*There is a 10% camp fee discount for registration of 5 or more weeks if paid in full by May 1st, 2011.

\*There is a 5% camp fee discount for all siblings attending the same weeks.

\*We will prorate the first and last week of camp if needed for shortened week(s) due to school schedules.

## Refund Policy:

1. Full cash refunds will only be issued to advanced registrations that cancel with 30 days notice prior to the start of camp, or for any week topic which the Center cancels.
2. Credits toward future programs will be issued to registrants who have bonafide illness and inform the Center prior to the start of the absence. Credits are valid for one year from the date of issue.
3. No refunds or credits will be given for other than the reasons above.

## Additional Information

### Extended Day Program: **New hours available! 6:30am to 5:30pm!**

**There are now 2 early morning sessions to choose from beginning at either 6:30am or 7:30 a.m. until the start of camp.** You **MUST** register in advance for the 6:30am timeslot! Our staff will **not** be here before 7:30am unless campers have registered and paid in advance! Fee is \$35/week for 6:30am and \$25/week for 7:30am drop off times. **The afternoon session operates from the close of camp at 4:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m.** The fee is \$25 per week for the afternoon program. Late pick-ups after 5:30 p.m. will be charged \$25 per hour for staff overtime.

### Dress:

Play clothes and **sturdy closed toe shoes or sneakers are a must!** Programs are held rain or shine, so bring raincoats if rain is possible. Indian Rock is always cooler than lower areas. Long pants are recommended.

### Lunch:

Campers must provide their own lunch and afternoon snack in a labeled paper or plastic bag. **No insulated containers are accepted** because lunches are required to be refrigerated and for refrigeration to be effective, containers must not be insulated. Drinks and ice cream are available for purchase ranging from 50 cents to \$2.50.

### Swimming:

Swimming is provided at one of our lake's two waterfronts, conditions permitting. Swimming and wading are supervised by certified lifeguards. Campers should bring a swimsuit and a towel daily.

### Health and Safety:

The camp, licensed by the state of Connecticut, Department of Health Services, has an excellent safety record. A first aid staff member is present all day to handle minor injuries and coordinate major injury with the proper health professionals. **Camp physicals are required and our physical examination form must be completed and on file prior to your child's attendance at camp. The physical examination must have taken place in the past 3 years. Campers without a current physical form on file are not permitted to attend camp by state law.** If any medication needs to be administered during camp hours, the **Authorization for the Administration of Medications Form**, located on the reverse side of our physical form **must** be completed. Medications must be in pharmacy prepared containers and labeled with the name of the child, name of the drug, strength, dosage, frequency, authorized prescriber's name, and date of original prescription. Over the counter medications must be in the original container and labeled with the child's name. Parents must check in medication at the office and provide the above named form at the beginning of camp attendance. Parents must also sign our medication log to confirm the amount of medication we received. **By state law, we cannot accept any medication without the above named documents. No camper is allowed to possess any medication on his/her person, including over the counter drugs, insect repellent, and suntan lotion.** Such labeled items will be collected and carried by the camper's counselor and given as needed. **No medications will be accepted at the bus stops. A parent or guardian must bring medications to Indian Rock and sign them in, and pick them up at camp at the end of each week.**
